

Need a hand? RMRH is here to help!

Rocky Mountain Rural Health has been helping residents of Park County with health-related concerns since 1989. We are still here in these unprecedented times with resources and connections ready to help. Our grantors have graciously given their permission to reallocate funds earmarked for other programs and projects to better serve the residents of Park County during the COVID crisis.

Due to current conditions, Rocky Mountain Rural Health is providing the majority of our services remotely. Please call us at 719-836-2169 for assistance in any of the following areas:

Connect for Health Colorado: If you have lost your employment and, as a result, your health insurance, you may qualify for a Special Enrollment Period (SEP). If you have lost hours of employment due to the COVID crisis, you may qualify for tax credits on your existing health insurance plan. We have certified health coverage guides on staff to assist you with the enrollment process or reporting changes to your income.

Non-Emergency Mileage Reimbursement: We have funds from two grants to reimburse qualified Park County residents for trips to health-related appointments. One grant is for Park County residents aged 60 or older. The other grant is for residents of either Alma or Fairplay. Both grants stipulate that funds be dispersed to people that do not qualify for non emergency mileage reimbursement under any other program.

Navigations Services: Can't find a doctor or specialist? Need help finding home health or durable medical equipment? Our Community Health Workers have contact information on hundreds of providers of health-related services. We also have contact information for agencies, organizations and government programs offering assistance during the COVID crisis.

Advance Caring Planning: Been thinking about the future while home in isolation? RMRH can help you put your wishes in writing by selecting an advance directive that best suits your end of life desires.

Medical Billing Assistance: Having trouble sorting through a stack of medical bills, trying to understand your insurance carrier's explanation of benefits, or believe you have been wrongly charged?

RMRH can help you work through the seemingly insurmountable mounds of paperwork to find answers and solutions.

Mental Health News

Interview with a Mental Health First Aid Instructor

Rocky Mountain Rural Health is dedicated to improving the physical and mental health of Park County residents. To that end two of RMRH's Community Health Workers (CHW) recently became certified as instructors of Mental Health First Aid. *Health Matters* interviewed one of the instructors to better understand the program.

HM: What is Mental Health First Aid (MHFA)?

CHW: MHFA teaches the public how to recognize symptoms of mental health problems and how to offer and provide initial help.

HM: Why is it important for the public to get trained in MHFA?

CHW: Many people are not well-informed about how to recognize mental health problems, how to respond and where to get help.

HM: Why did you want to be certified to teach Mental Health First Aid?

CHW: I wanted to get certified to teach these courses to help educate people and stop the stigma surrounding mental health. It's okay to see a doctor if you have a sore throat, it's also okay to see a professional for mental health issues. If we can catch it early on, perhaps we can prevent a tragedy.

HM: What did you find the most helpful in the instructor certification course?

CHW: One of the most helpful parts was learning what signs and symptoms to look for and learning that we are NOT there to diagnose or treat, just to offer initial help until appropriate professional help can be accessed.

HM: Were there any surprises?

CHW: Not for me personally but it could be upsetting for someone if they or their loved ones have experienced mental health issues. The course gave us ways to help participants that are feeling distressed.

HM: You have my interest and hopefully the interest of our readers. Say we want to attend a traditional MHFA class. What should we expect?

CHW: Mental Health First Aid is an 8-hour class that can be done all in one day or in two 4-hour sessions held within a one to two week period. Two different classes are available - one focuses on Adult Mental Health First Aid and the other is on Youth Mental Health First Aid. The youth training class focuses on young people 12 to 18 years of age. Both classes feature interactive sessions. Although no one has to get up in front of people or speak, participation is encouraged and it enriches the class. Some of the topics covered include depression, anxiety, trauma, and substance use disorders. Classes can also be conducted 'virtually'.

HM: Who should sign up for a Mental Health First Aid class?

CHW: Participants in either the youth or adult training class must be 18 years or older. I encourage anyone with an interest in helping others to take one or both of the classes. What you learn and put into practice may make all the difference in someone's life!
