Rocky Mountain Rural Health, working with Park County, the Town of Fairplay, the Town of Alma, and concerned residents spearheaded a ballot measure to form the South Park Health Service District with the goal of re-opening the medical clinic in Fairplay and supporting other health-related endeavors to improve access to services. Thanks to all who helped “get out the vote” and those who supported the measure by voting “yes”.



We have been successful in getting grants from the Summit Foundation, CHP/RCCO, El Pomar, Colorado Trust and the Colorado Health Foundation to continue our work in providing services to Park County residents. A new program supported by Caring for Colorado delivers assistance for transitions in care for patients discharged from a hospital back to their home.

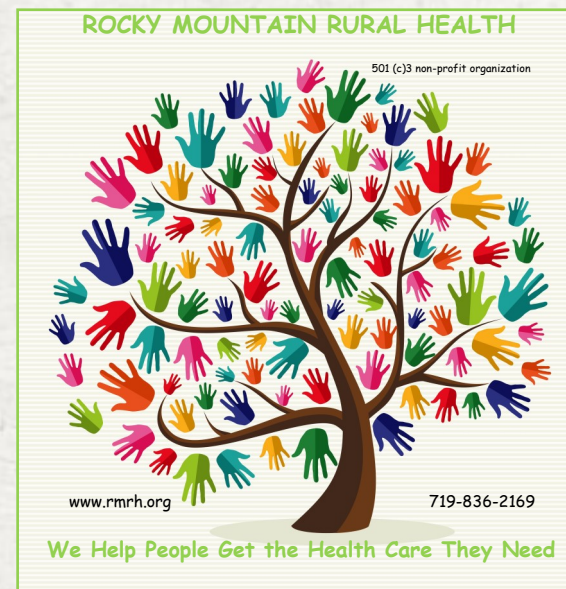

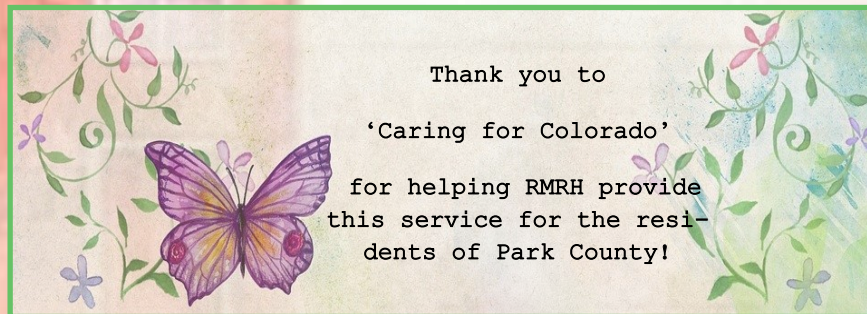

In this area with very limited health care services, we give clients the peace of mind they need by offering a home safety evaluation, medication reconciliation and care coordination with their primary care provider. Assistance is also given locating additional services that may be needed.

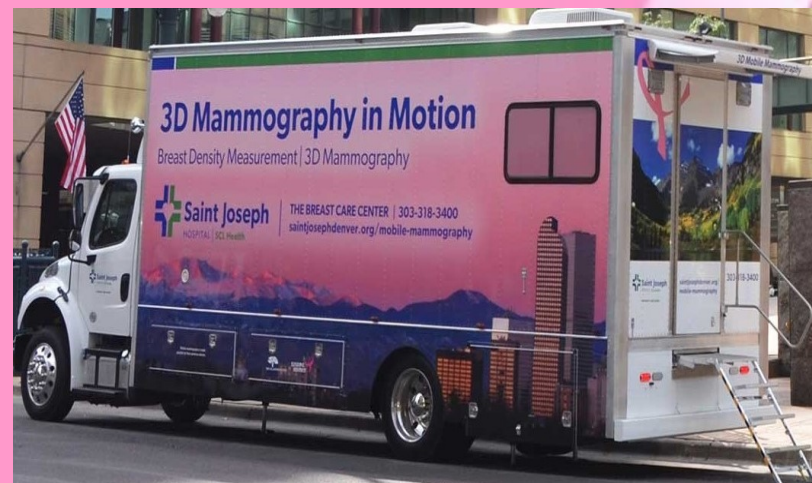

RMRH TAKES BREAST HEALTH SERIOUSLY!

WITH US, EVERY MONTH IS BREAST HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH!

We actively engage our community in the importance of routine screening at outreaches and special events throughout the year. We also sponsor the mobile mammography van from St. Joseph's Breast Care Center twice annually. We cover the cost of mammograms for those that are uninsured or underinsured. Women in need of additional imaging or treatment are offered assistance and given support.





RMRH recognizes that a key component to healthy living is health insurance. Our certified Health Coverage Guides assist Park County residents with health insurance enrollment through the marketplace, Connect for Health Colorado, not only during Open Enrollment but through out the year for residents that qualify for a Special Enrollment period.



Our Services

BENEFIT GUIDANCE

RMRH actively promotes healthy living by helping Park County Medicaid clients understand their benefits and by encouraging them to take advantage of all their benefits.

We stress the importance of establishing care with a primary care provider and help them find one in their plan. We encourage them to take advantage of the routine screenings available to them. We help clients find specialists and services. We make them aware of the dental and vision benefits available to them. We explain the non-emergency medical transportation part of their plan and tell them how to apply for mileage reimbursement. We offer assistance with Advance Care Planning. We contact clients recently discharged from the hospital to offer transition in care services.

In short, we want our clients to be as healthy as possible!

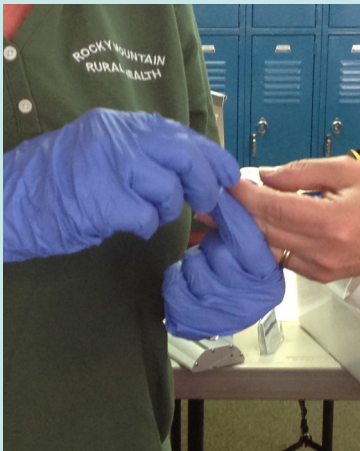

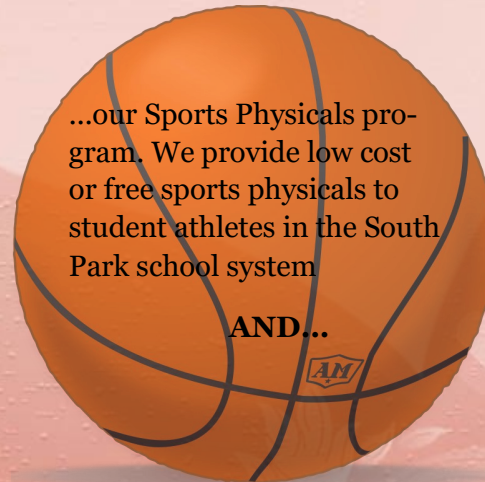
RMRH is able to assist community members facing setbacks due to health issues by means of financial support. We also work closely with other funding agencies to help individuals receive personal grants to meet their needs.

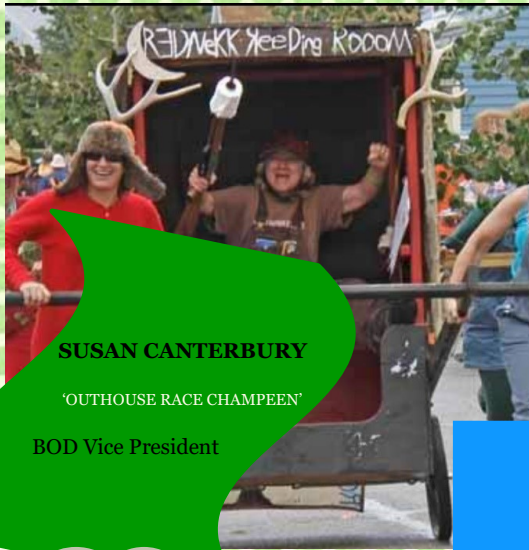

THE SOUTH PARK HEALTH SERVICE DISTRICT

RMRH has spearheaded the efforts to bring health care back to South Park and to reopen the clinic in Fairplay. Many potential partners - healthcare systems as well as individual providers - were engaged in discussions on what it would take to bring them into Park County. Bottom line - to make the Fairplay clinic a viable proposition for them the community would need to bring financial support to the table.

RMRH partnered with the Summit Community Care Clinic FQHQ in applying for a NAP (New Access Point) in Fairplay but no entities in Colorado were awarded this status.

RMRH then, with community partners, decided to win approval for a Special District supported by sales tax in order to generate the revenues required to sustain the clinic in Fairplay.

In November the voters approved this District and the South Park Health Service District was created. Requests for Proposals from healthcare systems have been sent out with a March deadline.

We look forward to the days ahead!

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF RMRH STAFF:

From Jason's phone log:

Chiropractor: A client called with a swollen leg. He thinks it is sciatica; it is not. Will you call him and convince him to go to the hospital immediately?

Jason to client: Sir, the swelling could be a life threatening blood clot. Let's select the nearest hospital to you and get you moving...



From Julie's outreach report:

30 year old female with out of range high blood pressure referred to PCP at last month's outreach. At current outreach she states she doesn't have gas money to get to PCP and her BP is still high; NEMT mileage reimbursement explained to her; she took information and scheduled appointment with PCP while we were still there.

From Barbie's case notes:

PCDHS referred client to RMRH whose Medicaid eligibility had lapsed; in discussion with client it was learned he was a diabetic and out of his medication for several days due to lapse in Medicaid coverage; his pharmacy was contacted and prescription was paid by RMRH over the phone; assistance offered reestablishing Medicaid coverage.

From Anne's data files:

Client without a vehicle had teenage daughter facing surgery in Denver; RMRH arranged for hotel accommodations for family near hospital for the two days child would be hospitalized and arranged for mileage reimbursement for travel to and from Denver so family and friends could help with transportation.



From Shredder's perspective: I love greeting clients when they come to the office; they all seem so happy when they see me...the best ones bring me biscuits when they come back!
